

NYVT Media reaches beyond Washington County, Lakes Region

Now in its sixth year of serving Washington County in New York and the Lakes Region of Vermont, NYVT Media has expanded its focus to include Albany, Columbia, Greene and Schoharie counties.

The NYVT Media story started in November 2019 when Manchester Newspapers of Granville was acquired by Capital Region Independent Media, including its newspapers, specialty publications, website, and associated social media presences. Manchester Newspapers had been incorporated in the 1980s.

Moving forward with the company's publications, branding, and presence in such avenues as social media has been a goal since day one. In May 2020, the company rebranded as Manchester Media. The public got its first look at the current logo at this time.

The first website redesign appeared in October 2020, with a new address at nyvtmedia.com and accordingly the company was renamed to its current name, NYVT Media.

NYVT Media relocated in April 2021 to its current office in the Big Lots strip mall on Quaker Street.

Border Country Sports was acquired from Keith Harrington in August 2022. Harrington continues as the sports writer in the company's north division.

In early 2023, The Columbia Paper in Ghent was acquired from its owner, Parry Teasdale.

A new component of NYVT Media's coverage of the communities it serves is broadcasting. Following a soft start in sports in the fall 2023 season, sports broadcasting was in full swing in the fall 2024 season. Municipal meetings and interviews have been added to the

broadcasting efforts. There are plans to further grow this component of NYVT Media in the coming years, in Granville and beyond.

In October 2024 the Cobleskill Times-Journal was acquired from its owner Jim Poole, along with the associated firm, The Printers.

An all-new website was launched at nyvtmedia.com in late March 2025, combining the online presence of all the NYVT Media and Capital Region Independent Media publications, which also include the Ravena News-Herald in Albany County and the Greenville Pioneer in Greene County. Going forward the NYVT Media brand will be used for all entities.

NYVT Media continues to focus on bringing news, video and other content to the people of the communities in the regions the company serves.

Meet the NYVT Media team

The modern newsroom consists of a diverse team of people, each playing a pivotal role in the output of a quality news product. Across the entire gamut of what goes into putting newspapers on shelves, NYVT Media has a small but mighty team that all play their part.

Originally Manchester Newspapers, Mark Vinciguerra, president of Capital Region Independent Media, purchased the company in 2019 and it's since flown under the NYVT Media banner.

"I felt strongly that communities such as the ones we serve that tend to be rural, need local fact-based journalism and media as much as anyone else, and that they needed to be modernized into a world where printed products are important, but not the only thing," he said. "John Manchester, to his credit, knew he wasn't going to be the one to move Manchester Newspapers into that new world, and he sought me out to purchase his family's papers to allow them to survive and thrive going forward, and ensure the Washington County and Rutland County areas continue to be served by local journalism reporting on the news, advertising and events important to these areas."

Julie Fedler joined the team in 2018 as a part-time sales representative while still under the Manchester Newspapers banner, and now serves as the general manager for the Granville office, over-

seeing every facet of operation.

"It's really cool to see how far our company has come, and while it is a struggle for small businesses, it really is important and empowering to help lead them into the future," Fedler said.

Chelsea Smith is the team's director of marketing, making sure the community is familiar with the NYVT Media brand.

"My job is to attract more readers, bring in money, and keep us visible in the busy world of media," Smith said. "I focus on things like creating fun marketing campaigns to get people excited about our news, events, and advertising opportunities. Essentially, my job is to make sure everyone knows why NYVT Media is the best choice for news and advertising."

Reporters are responsible for finding and writing newsworthy stories in a timely manner, keeping on track with deadlines week in and week out. NYVT Media has a total of five reporters, consisting of Erik Pekar, Catherine Oliviero, EJ Conzola and Keith Harrington, and Doug LaRocque is our senior reporter. LaRocque started in the world of sports broadcasting before moving into all aspects of journalism.

"I most enjoy breaking news and stories that boost community groups and activities, shining a positive light, so to speak," he said. "Perhaps the most

memorable moments are a private sit-down interview with President Gerald Ford and a brief conversation with Walter Cronkite. I've been around for a while."

Before stories make it to publishing, our proofreader Bern Zovistoski edits all copy, making sure it adheres to the Associated Press (AP) style.

"What I enjoy most about being a proofreader is the satisfaction that what I do has an important purpose, to inform people of the facts as best as they can be determined," Zovistoski said.

The sales team of a local media company is the lifeblood of the entire operation. Advertising dollars keep news in circulation, appealing to more advertisers, ideally in perpetuity. Renae McKittrick, Deb Brosseau and Tammy Pratt, work with local businesses to help them get the exposure they need to grow and develop a wider presence in Washington County and the Lakes Region of Vermont.

"I enjoy helping local businesses grow and introducing new marketing and audience strategies," McKittrick said. "Presenting can be challenging because the same methods have been applied for years. Presenting new methods with proven facts that create trackable results equaling success for businesses is very rewarding."



Sentinel-Times' Granville heritage goes back to 1875

Starting this year, the Granville Sentinel and the Whitehall Times are merged together as a single newspaper.

The Granville Sentinel traces its beginnings to 1875, when James Lillie McArthur came to Granville from Putnam, seeking to launch a weekly in Granville at the encouragement of Granville Postmaster B.F. Ottarson. McArthur met with Granville's leading citizens of the era and all were supportive of him.

The first issue of the Granville Sentinel was published on Sept. 17, 1875. At the time, it was located on the second floor of the 76 Main St. building. The Sentinel moved around a few times in those early years, to the Bardwell block at the corner of Main and Church Streets, then to the Perry block on Church Street, then by the early 1880s to its longtime location on North Street.

In 1879 and 1880, McArthur attempted a daily newspaper, and ran a Daily Sentinel. He resumed the weekly Granville Sentinel, but tried two more times at semi-weekly publication in 1883 and 1891.

In late 1880, McArthur started other newspaper efforts, and left the publishing work to his brother-in-law George Weller, but retained ownership. With the exception of a brief return in 1882, McArthur was out of the picture at the Sentinel through 1886.

In late 1885, the village water reservoir, then located on the side of Pine Hill near the Sentinel office, burst its embankments and flooded the Sentinel office. Weller decided to turn the paper over to his wife Mary Weller and her sister, Anna Lewis McArthur.

The Sentinel encountered its only major competition in 1886, when the Rev. Davis started the Granville Republican and Farmer's Advocate. Anna McArthur asked her husband to return, and James Lillie McArthur returned and started writing editorials, for which he was known in his time. The two papers went into a heated rivalry for several years, until the Rev. Davis shuttered his paper in March 1891 and left town.

The Sentinel has modernized itself over the years. One of the big jumps was taken in 1913, when the old method of hand setting the type gave way to automatic typesetting with the acquisition of a Mergenthaler mechanical typesetting machine.

McArthur's son-in-law, Major Paul R. Manchester, resigned his U.S. Army commission in 1919 and joined the McArthurs in running the Sentinel.

James Lillie McArthur died in 1925, and his wife Anna McArthur and son-in-law Paul R. Manchester continued the Sentinel. A grandson, MacArthur Manchester, started working for the Sentinel in the 1930s.

The cylindrical press was replaced with a modern press in 1932. Major Manchester died in January 1941. The Sentinel was continued by his second wife, Nan Evans Manchester, and his son MacArthur. In 1942, MacArthur Manchester joined the Reserve Officers Association publication and sold his share in the Sentinel.

Nan Manchester died in December 1952; her will provided the Sentinel be published by the executors of her estate for 10 years. Thomas J. King and "Bob" Downey ran the Sentinel in that time. At the end of the 10 years, in 1962, MacArthur Manchester assumed owner-

ship, and in 1963 he formally resigned from the Reserve Officers Association publication to directly manage the Sentinel.

In 1969, the Sentinel made the switch from letterpress to offset printing, with the July 24 issue the last to be printed on North Street in Granville, and the July 31 issue the first to be printed by offset elsewhere.

The Sentinel celebrated its 100th anniversary in 1975. A slate plaque was presented to publisher MacArthur Manchester by Norton Sealants at the commemorative banquet. Computer technology first entered the Sentinel publishing process in 1981. John Manchester joined the Sentinel as executive editor in December 1981. The Sentinel began to feature more articles by reporters around 1983.

MacArthur Manchester published the Sentinel until his death in May 1992. His wife Anita Manchester became publisher, and ran the paper in the same style as her husband. The Sentinel switched from broadsheet size paper to tabloid size in June 1995. The offices moved from North Street to East Main Street in November 1995.

History of the Sentinel-Times

Anita Manchester published the Sentinel until her death in May 2000, and at that time John Manchester became publisher. In his time the Sentinel and Manchester Newspapers added a website and started a social media presence.

In November 2019 the Sentinel, along with all other associated publications of Manchester Newspapers, was sold to Capital Region Independent Media. The office is now located on Quaker Street.

The last issue of the Granville Sentinel under its own nameplate was the Dec. 26, 2024, issue. Starting with the Jan. 9, 2025, issue, the Granville Sentinel and the Whitehall Times have been merged, and continue as a single publication called the Sentinel-Times.









RERC helps grow outdoor recreation and revitalize Granville

RERC – Four letters that by themselves may not mean much. Put them together and they form an acronym that stands for Recreational Economy for Rural Communities. And that means a lot for Granville, a whole lot.

RERC programs are managed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Office of Community Revitalization. It offers planning assistance, which helps communities identify strategies to grow their outdoor recreation economy and revitalize their Main Street.

In the spring of 2023, Granville was notified that its application to join the program was approved, one of only 25 such approvals throughout the nation.

Shortly afterward, state, county and federal officials took a tour of Granville's recreational areas and held a two-day workshop to talk about the RERC program. In the long run, the program could mean up to \$25 million in grants for downtown revitalization and enhanced recreational sites and programs.

Two projects identified under the program have been completed in the past year. One was the new pickleball courts located by the entrance of Mettowee Park on Church Street. Since they opened in August 2024, the asphalt surface facilities have been perpetually busy.

Another accomplishment was the new Granville website. It is described as a "all in one, inclusive website," to direct visitors to information about the town and the village and in particular where to enjoy recreational, tourism and business-oriented pursuits.

While the website welcomes any attention it draws from around the nation, in particular it concentrates on drawing in visitors from a 50-mile radius, or about an hour's drive from Granville.

Grant money attracted by the program is being used this year to upgrade the waterline from Church Street to Main Street. The water main along this portion of roadway is currently 4 inches in width, not really large enough to accommodate 21st century needs. This will be upgraded to a 10-inch main, which will connect to the already upgraded main along East

Main Street. The benefits are many, including increased pressure, the ability to properly supply sprinkler systems and meet the increased pumping capacity of modern-day firefighting apparatus. Another benefit will be the ability of the village to transfer water between its two holding tanks, something a 4-inch line does not have the capacity to accomplish.

One of the major components of the RERC planning was improvements to the D&H Rail Trail. The trail starts at Depot Street on its north end, progressing southward through the downtown sector and integrating with local community features such as small businesses, restaurants, stores and residential homes. Southeast of the village the trail transitions back to a rural mixed landscape of open fields and densely wooded areas.

Planned upgrades include the installation of new signage, both on roadways warning of the trail's crossing and along the trail's 4.75-mile length informing users they are about to cross a roadway.

Other considerations include the possible resurfacing of the trail, either with asphalt or a less expensive crushed stone base. Long term, there remains the hope of someday extending the trail to join elements in Cambridge and Poultney, VT.

Autumn Leaves Car Show

Autumn Leaves Car Show: An iconic event for nearly 40 years

The arrival of autumn generally is known by the appearance of fall foliage, cooler weather, and shorter days. In the Granville area, however, autumn starts with the Autumn Leaves Car Show.

Every year, hundreds of classic car and other vehicle enthusiasts descend upon the village of Granville for this annual event. The Granville Area Chamber of Commerce has sponsored the event since the very first was held in 1987.

This year, the 38th annual event will take place Sunday, Sept. 28. This will be the third show to be held at the old carnival grounds at 83 East Potter Ave.; the location was well received the last two years.

Many types of vehicles are displayed at the show, from classic cars and hot rods to customs, trucks and motorcycles.

Those who want to show their car or

vehicle in this show can register between 8 and 11 a.m. on the day of the event for \$20. Participants will receive a dash plaque, two door-prize tickets, a gas card drawing ticket and a 2025 Autumn Leaves Car Show commemorative T-shirt.

The show is open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. The entrance for spectators is on Park Avenue. Admission is \$5, with kids under 15 admitted free. Each spectator receives a door prize as well as a sheet to vote for the Best of Show and their top five favorite vehicles, the latter of which determines the Top 20 awards.

In additions to the many cool vehicles which will be shown, there are other amenities. The Granville Rotary Club will sell food and beverages, and music will be provided.

A newer component of the show is the Autumn Leaves Craft Fair. The fair

was added in its second year to the car show, and 2025 will be the fifth version of this popular event.

Another popular feature of the show is the awards at the show's end. Participants will have many opportunities to receive such awards as the Top 20, "Best of Show," "Most Chrome," "Best Paint Job," "Most Likely to Get Pulled Over" and others. The show's major sponsors also bestow awards on participants. Slate plaques are donated by a local slate company.

Last year's event was one of the biggest on record, with about 270 cars and over 900 spectators. Sunshine and good weather drove attendance up, both for those showing their cars, and spectators.




